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Early Childhood Education Expansion

UCP of Maine opened a brand new K-2 classroom and program within the Bridges department. The new classroom, located at Evergreen Woods on

Mt. Hope Ave. in Bangor, is currently accepting referrals and once full, can serve up to 10 students.

Andrea Richards, Director of Early Childhood Services for UCP of Maine recently shared, "We are excited to be opening this new classroom and expanding the Bridges program to now offer education from kindergarten to second grade.

We will be working closely with local community schools and creating specially designed instruction for each student. The Success For All curriculum, that we will be using, supports play and social development, as well as including literacy, handwriting, and art."

Also, UCP of Maine is pleased to announce we received a \$2,500 grant from the TEGNA Foundation as part of their community grants program that addresses critical community needs and initiatives. These funds were used to help create a new classroom for our Bridges, Early Childhood Education program. The Bridges program is a center-based education program for toddlers and preschoolers who require individualized support for a variety of reasons, including behavioral, motor, sensory
