

Waiver Homes: Supporting Waiver Home Residents in Non-Disability Settings

I. Purpose

To confirm UCP's commitment to supporting residents in non-disability settings.

II. Policy/Procedure

UCP of Maine will ensure that residents can choose to receive a portion of their direct support service (typically provided in the residential setting) outside of the residential setting, in non-disability-specific settings in the broader community, particularly during times other services are not available to the individual. Residents are able to choose from a variety of activities on any day when services are provided. Examples include, but are not limited to: employment in the community, volunteer opportunities in the community and integrated community activities such as health clubs, community centers, clubs, and faith-based activities.

Informational resources about upcoming opportunities for community involvement are posted in the common area for all supported residents to view.
